SEMESTER-I

CC-I- (History of India- From Earliest Times to 600 A.D)

Through this course of study students are learn about the early Indian notions of history, pre-historic cultures, Origin and features of Harappan civilization, Vedic civilizations, changing the political formations in ancient era.

CC-II (Social Formation and Cultural Patterns of the Ancient World)

Through this course we try to give an idea to the students about the evolution of Human society and beginning of food production, bronze-age civilization Mesopotamia, advent of Iron in West Asia, Ancient Greek Civilization and their cultural activities.

SEMESTER-II

CC-III (History of India II (600-1206 A.D)

By studying this course the students are learned about the political, social, economical and cultural history of early medieval India.

CC-IV (Social Formation and Cultural Patterns of the Medieval World)

Through this course of study the students are learned about the Roman history and culture in the medieval world, religion and culture of medieval Europe and the societies in Central Islamic Lands.

SEMESTER-III

CC-V (History of India (1206-1525 A.D.)

Through this course the students learned about the establishment of Delhi Sultanate and its socio-economy, political and cultural activities.

CC-VI (RISE OF THE MODERN WEST-I (15TH AND 16TH CENURY)

Through this course the students are learned about the Emergence of 15th and 16th Century's Modern West specially Transition from Feudalism to Capitalism, Renaissance, Reformation movement and State System in Europe.

CC-VII (History of India –iv (1526-1757 C.E.)

From this course the students have learned about the history of the Mughal Empire and its various aspects.

SEC-I (Archives and Museums in India)

Through this course the students are learned about the origin and development of Archives and Museums in India and its role on Research, Education and on Society.

SEMESTER-IV

CC- VIII (RISE OF THE MODERN WEST-II (17TH AND 18TH CENTURY)

From this course the students learned the European crisis of 17th century, the English Revolution and European politics in the 18th century.

CC-IX (History of India (1757-1857 C.E)

The students are learned from this course the Foundation of English East India Company's rule in India, Renaissance, Reforms and Popular Resistance in this period.

CC-X (History of India (1858-1964 C.E.)

Through this course the students are learned about the early phase of Indian Freedom Movement, the Gandhian era, Communal politics and the Nehruvian Era.

SEMESTER-V

CC-XI-(History of Modern Europe-II (1789-1870)

From this course the students are learned about the French Revolution, and its European Repercussions, Industrial Revolution, age of Nationalism etc.

CC XII (Studying History writing: Indian and Western)

From this course the students have learned about the basic components of History and history writings.

DSE-I (Life and Culture in Pre-colonial Bengal: Pre-historic times to mid 18th century)

Through this course of study the students are learned about the socio-cultural history of Ancient and Medieval Bengal.

DSE-II (Life and Culture in Colonial Bengal (1757-1947)

Through this course the students are learned the establishment of East India Company's rule in Bengal and in social and economic life, impact of company's rule, emergence of Nationalism etc.

SEMESTER-VI

CC-XIII (History of Modern Europe –ii (1871-1945)

Through this course the students are learned about the Modern Europe specially about the First World War and its impact, the prelude to Second World War and its consequences.

CC-XIV (Making of the Contemporary World (1946-2000)

Through this course the students are learned about the post War development, Cold-War, changing the perspectives of world politics.

DSE-III (History of Modern East Asia-I (1840-1919)

From this course the students are learned about the pre-colonial China and its relations with the English others Foreigners. They also learned about the pre- Meiji Japan and Meiji- Restoration Japan and its developments.

DSE-IV (History of China and Japan (1919-1939)

Through this course the students are learned about the Nationalism in China, the Communist party movements. On the other side they have learned rise of Modern Japan and Imperialism of Japan and its involvement in second world war.
